FIGHT MEASLES It starts with you



Measles causes rash and fever. It is easy to spread and can cause serious illness,

especially in young children. People who are not protected can get measles by going into a room where a person with measles has been, even up to 2 hours after that person has left.



Get Vaccinated

The measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine provides the best protection against this disease.





Stay home if you are sick

Measles is very easy to spread. Stay home and away from other people in the house. Do not go to school, work, or travel until 5 days after the rash appears.



Cover your cough or sneeze

Cover your mouth and nose with your sleeve or a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Toss your used



Wash your hands

Wash your hands thoroughly and often with soap and warm water.
